

023 ANNUAL REPORT

Our Year in Review:

2022-23 was a year of returning to a "new normal". Like most nonprofit service organizations, we found the silver lining from our long period of forced isolation and social distancing. Our recovery included a return to full staffing, a healthy funnel of new qualified candidates through recruiting, and identification of new donors and partners as new fundraising programs were introduced.

Highlights included the implementation of improved standard operating procedures and the construction of a new four-season Activity Shack to increase recreational opportunities for all residents. Here are a few other results and achievements from the past year:

55 Adults lived in our Community Housing Units We operate three apartments & two shared living units with a capacity for **30** adults.


36 Adults were provided with 24-hr care We operate three 24-hour care homes with a capacity for 33 adults. Adults stayed in our Transition Residence Wellness Journey spans 1-3 years and accommodates up to 8 adults at a time.

Adults were admitted in our Crisis Centre We can assist up to 5 adults simultaneously.

We provide housing and support services to **adults living with mental illness** working in partnership with social development and our two regional health authorities. We help adults in the Greater Moncton Area to manage their mental health, experience a better quality of life, be more independent and remain connected to their community.
